PARISH NURSE

PREPARE FOR SPRING WEATHER



Spring weather can be unpredictable. When severe weather hits unexpectedly, the risk of injury and weather-related death increases, so planning makes sense. Prepare for storms, floods, and tornadoes as if you know in advance they are coming, because in the spring, they very likely will.

Spring is the time of year when many things change—including the weather. Temperatures can swing back and forth between balmy and frigid. Sunny days may be followed by a week of stormy weather. Sometimes extreme weather changes can occur even within the same day. Mark Twain once said, “In the spring I have counted one hundred and thirty-six kinds of weather inside of four and twenty hours.”

Thunderstorms cause most of the severe spring weather. They can bring lightning, tornadoes, and flooding. Whenever warm, moist air collides with cool, dry air, thunderstorms can occur. For much of the world, this happens in spring and summer.

Because spring weather is so unpredictable, you may be unprepared when severe weather hits—particularly if you live in a region that does not often experience thunderstorms, tornadoes, or flooding. And when severe weather hits unexpectedly, the risk of injury and death increases. So planning ahead makes sense; prepare for storms, floods, and tornadoes as if you know in advance they are coming, because in the spring, they very likely will.

Advance planning for thunderstorms, lightning, tornadoes, and floods requires specific safety precautions. You can follow many of the same steps for all extreme weather events. Keep an emergency kit on hand. Some items to include are:

- A battery-operated flashlight, a battery-operated NOAA Weather Radio, and extra batteries for both
- An emergency evacuation or shelter plan, including a map of your home and, for every type of severe weather emergency, routes to safety from each room
- A list of important personal information, including: telephone numbers of neighbors, family, and friends; insurance and property information; telephone numbers of utility companies; medical information

According to the American Red Cross a first aid kit external icon may include:

- non-latex gloves
- assortment of adhesive bandages
- antibiotic ointment
- sterile gauze pads in assorted sizes
- absorbent compress dressings
- tweezers
- scissors
- adhesive cloth tape
- aspirin packets (81 mg each)
- first aid instruction booklet (NOTE: Customize your first aid kit external icon to meet your individual and family needs.)

- A 3–5 day supply of bottled water and nonperishable food
- Personal hygiene items
- Blankets or sleeping bags
- An emergency kit pdf icon[1.08 MB] in your car



Advance planning for thunderstorms, lightning, tornadoes, and floods requires specific safety precautions.



Often by the time we are aware of an approaching storm, we have little if any time to prepare for it. Prepare your family members for the possibility of severe weather. Tell them where to seek appropriate shelter as soon as they are aware of an approaching storm. Practice your emergency plan for every type of severe weather. Show family members where the emergency supplies are stored, and make sure they know how to turn off the water, gas, and electricity in your home. Often by the time we are aware of an approaching storm, we have little if any time to prepare for it. But we do know that when spring arrives, thunderstorms, tornadoes, and floods are real possibilities. So why not take the surprise factor out of severe weather and prepare yourself, your family, and your home? If thunderstorms, tornadoes, and floods do occur, you'll be ready for them.

SULLIVAN CAMPUS VOTING RESULTS

Following the worship service on March 27th, we had our Congregational Meeting to vote whether to sell or lease the Sullivan Campus property. We had a quorum of **64 people** and the final vote was **60 people** voted to **sell** the property and **4 people** voted to **lease** the property.

60 Sell the property
4 Lease the property

A second vote was taken which approved the proposal that 50% would be set aside in an investment fund with the annual interest going into the General Operating Budget, and, 50% would be set aside in an investment fund with no more than 25% of the annual fund balance to be used for major building renovations and/or repairs

Notes for Advent Lutheran Church

- **Expenses exceed income by \$6,428.**
- Average monthly income came in \$1,750 lower than average budgeted monthly income.
- Sunday offerings for January - February 2022 came in \$8,119 lower than January- February 2021.
- Average monthly expenses came in \$472 higher than average budgeted monthly expenses.
- Expenses included the budgeted disbursement (10%) of benevolence dollars for the ELCA, Spokane Valley Partners, Maasai Health Systems, and Lutheran Community Services.

Notes for Advent Lutheran Child Center

- **Income exceeded expenses by \$4,038.**
- Total income for January - February 2022 decreased by \$17,635 when compared to January - February 2021. The decrease in income was mainly due to \$30,000 of Grant income that was received in February 2021. However, private pay tuition increased by \$19,837 in January—February 2022, which helped to offset the difference.
- Total expenses for January—February 2022 decreased by \$3,073 when compared to January —February 2021. This decrease was mainly due to January—February 2022 payroll expenses increasing by \$14,708 due to raises in staff compensation which was offset by \$30,000 of 2021 Grant expenditures.
- The Center has \$154,818 in reserve, which translates to 1.9 months of budgeted expenses. In order to maintain financial health, it is the goal of the Center to maintain at least one month of budgeted expenses in its reserve (\$80,185).

PEOPLE IN OUR PRAYERS
