#### **HAPPY HELPERS**

On the 17<sup>th</sup> of May there was a good Advent Lutheran Church turn-out for the "Farewell Bob Tour" at Lutherhaven • Camp on Coeur D' Alene Lake. Bob Baker was his same affable self as he led us in songs, quips, and historical stories / picture slides of Lutherhaven Camp, since taking it over from the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) in 1946. The improvements, additions, and new construction that have taken place, and that are currently going on there are amazing! The land acquisitions that Camp Lutherhaven has made are remarkable. Most of you know about the Shoshone Mountain Retreat, which was acquired in 2009. Well, since that time, Shoshone Creek Ranch along with McPherson Meadows (both are further up the Coeur D'Alene river) and Bethany Community Center (located in Osburn, Idaho) have been added. Each one of those acquisitions came with its own unique "God Story" – which Bob Baker told us in his own entertaining way. The Camp Lutherhaven on-site improvements are also phenomenal. Most impressive are the 9,000 square foot Broken Arrow Lodge that is currently under construction and the new, fully funded \$420,000 commercial docks (with boat slips) that will be installed next month. Throughout the Golden Ager presentation, Bob Baker reminded us that the new construction and land acquisitions are only made possible through donations and volunteer work. Even though it is easy to become distracted by all the grandeur and excitement of the new construction and acquisitions, Bob was clear that the focus of Camp Lutherhaven, with all of its ministries, is to bring Jesus Christ into the lives of children, families and people.

#### **PARISH NURSE**

This month's topic is on mental health and God's character, we address one of the most common topics: anxiety.

If we're honest, Jesus said some bizarre things about anxiety. In his teachings, Jesus offers hope for how to calm anxiety, but it comes through what might feel like an odd method. What if we looked to God's character as an antidote for our anxiety and fears? Let's consider how the faithfulness of God can settle our hearts and minds and give us peace.

#### **KEY IDEAS:**

- Matthew 6:25-34 "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, vet I tell vou, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O you of little faith? Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you. Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble.'
- John Webster: "Anxiety is the dark shadow of the uniquely human capacity to hope."
- Anxiety is dress-rehearsing the unfaithfulness of God.
   Anxiety functionally says something false about God that he is unaware, inattentive, or unable.
- Without God's kingdom, anxiety makes perfect sense.
   But if there is a new kingdom, we can have rest, and we can trust that this is a world in which we can encounter a faithful God.
- Overcoming anxiety is more than just acknowledging that you don't have control. It's about cultivating a settled heart that no longer clings to control.

As a reminder, this series does not minimize the importance and necessity of professional mental health support, but it does remind us as believers that the Lord cares for us and that the scriptures have something to offer us as we seek health and wholeness. Listen to why we're talking about these issues in part 1, "Why Mental Health?"
