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LETTER FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Hello Advent,
How many of you know that November is the National Month of Gratitude? It's a time to reflect on all the things that you're most grateful for and to be reminded that saying "thank you" will convey your gratitude. Because November is mostly famous for the Thanksgiving holidays and being thankful for our many blessings, my family used to share around the dinner table the three "G"s; be grateful, show gratitude and give to others. I remember my mother always reminding our family her favorite quote by John F. Kennedy as something we should live by, "As we express our gratitude, we must never forget that the highest appreciation is not the words we utter, but to live by them". She also always reminded us that gratitude is a way to make positive changes in your life and to be thankful for God's love.

At the recent Council meeting we discussed the following items:

- (1) voted to approve the September Council meeting minutes
- (2) voted to approve the replacement of heaters in the Child Center classroom. They will be installed near the ceiling instead of on the baseboards. The bid cost is \$2,850 to be split with the Child Center.
- (3) voted to approve two Youth Group fundraisers; pumpkin carving and making and selling Lefse.
- (4) discussed the upcoming **December 8th Congregational Meeting**. The booklet is being prepared but is awaiting the 2025 budget approval at the November Council meeting. *Please mark your calendars to attend the meeting because a quorum is needed to pass the budget.*
- (5) discussed the purchase of a 15 seat bus with an approximate cost between \$40,000 - \$60,000. A 20-20-20 plan was proposed which was described three areas where the funds could be raised from; church investments, endowment fund yearly distribution and the congregation/Child Center donations and fundraisers.
- (6) the Child Center will be holding another **"Art on Broadway"** on **November 22nd**.
- (7) **Tree of Sharing** is scheduled to begin on **November 24th**.
- (8) **Santa Lucia** to be celebrated on **December 15th** after worship.

In closing, I would like to share as reminders two thoughts for not only my church family, but also my immediate family and friends; first is a quote by Desmond Tutu, "You don't choose your family. They are God's gift to us, as you are to them". Secondly, I would say give thanks not just on Thanksgiving Day but everyday of your life by showing your gratitude to others, be thankful for your family and be thankful for God's blessings.

PASTOR MATT'S CORNER

I find it ironic that heading into this election season and November 6th we seem to be finding more and more ways to see the "other" as clueless, dumb, or even wrong (on so many levels). Our words and actions become more biting and defensive. We find ourselves drawing lines and making "camp" in one party or candidate (knowing that we are right, of course) and then later in the month we celebrate Thanksgiving. A time to give thanks for all that we have. I pray that however elections turn out we remember that we are a thankful people. As I was wondering about this subject, I decided to look and see how many times thanks or thanksgiving comes up in the Bible? 72. 72 times the word comes up in the Bible. That's impressive enough, except I ran into another number....157. The word Gratitude shows up 157 times in the Bible. Double the amount of thanks. Now, there could be a whole sermon in this one. However, I would like for us to see that gratitude is stressed more often in the Bible. So, what is the difference? It's a feeling of appreciation for both big and small things in your life. In many cases, thankfulness arises from something specific, such as someone holding the door open for you. Gratitude, however, is a more lasting emotion that arises from reflecting on the many things you are thankful for. The MANY things you are thankful for. When we give thanks to God, we typically are giving thanks for many things (health, life, family, mercy, forgiveness, Jesus!) Let your attitude be gratitude. Don't let the one season (election season) overtake the other season (Thanksgiving) this month. Live into gratitude. And talking about words or phrases that are repeated in the Bible, guess which verse is repeated more often than any other? "Give thanks to the Lord for he is good! His love endures forever!" 44 times. Don't just give thanks once....live your life in gratitude. I, for one, give thanks and am grateful for all of you here at Advent (no matter how you vote)!
