LETTER FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

As the new year has begun already, my prayer for Advent is to always be successful! In order to continue our past successes that we have experienced, it will require participation from each member of the congregation. The old adage says "it takes a village " but in our case it is the congregation. With all of our collaborations and motivation we can facilitate the work needed to reaching our goals and objectives in 2025. With constant input from each of you, your positive energy, ideas and suggestions, they will transform any challenges we face into successful opportunities.

Mario Andretti, famous race car driver, had an inspirational quote he shared with his team about reaching goals and being successful; "Desire is the key to motivation but its determination and commitment to an unrelenting pursuit of your goal or commitment to excellence that will enable you to attain the success you seek".

Recently Advent has had a couple of successful goals:

1-Congratulations are in order to the Congregation for reaching and exceeding the goal to purchase the Church Bus. The \$70,000 plus raised will allow us to find better options for the bus. The Council has been searching, but we ask the congregation to assist by providing any contacts that can help locate the best option.

2-Thank you to the congregation for voting to approve the 2025 budget at the recent December Congregational meeting. The Council worked diligently in preparing the budget and appreciates the positive response. That being said, the Council will be loosing three Council members in June, so we are looking for volunteers to fill those positions. I am asking each of you to consider volunteering because we need to continue the good work the Council does.

As a reminder, Goals are basically the guide to our choices and Motivation is genuinely the force that drives us to pursue our goals. The Bible shares many perspectives that takes us beyond achievements, but tells us what true success is and how we can reach our goals with God's grace; Proverbs 16:3 "Committee to the Lord, in whatever you do, and he will establish your plans".

THOUGHTS FROM VICAR BRENDAN

The church liturgical year ends in early December as the season after Pentecost rolls into Advent. New Year's Eve marks the end of one calendar year and the start of the next. In the finance world, January and February are months of boxing up last year's records and making room for new ones, reconciling and closing statements, and finalizing new budgets. And at Lutherhaven, the next few months will be busy developing program and hiring staff for a new summer of camp. It often feels like we live in a constant state of old seasons winding down and new ones beginning.

In Luke's gospel, Simeon has already proclaimed Jesus as "a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel" (2:32) and Jesus has now declared Isaiah's scripture has been fulfilled with His coming (4:21). Soon, Jesus will begin calling His disciples. And Jesus continues to call each of us to this new creation in whatever vocation we are gifted to serve. Whatever our present context, Jesus is also calling us to new life and new creation.

I pray that in the context of your own endings and new beginnings, you will keep discerning God's presence in your own life and join in the celebration, embrace the challenge of spreading the Good News, and welcome all to God's grace in our lives.





ADVENT LUTHERAN CHILD CENTER NEWS

By Heidi Perry, Director With February being a month that is traditionally about love, I thought it would be good to share an important concept we have been working on with our staff the past few years. It's the idea that children must first feel safe and loved before they can learn. There are many different educational theories or programs that use this concept in different forms, but my favorite way to see it worded is: Children will first ask, "Am I safe? Am I loved?" Only then will they be able to learn.

Teachers and parents often think that children are dropped off at school or child care and they are ready to learn. This is not the case until step 1 (safety) and step 2 (love) have been met. These steps might have to happen over and over again due to circumstances out of our control (moving, staff turnover, illness, etc).

Safety is not just physical safety, but also the idea that they know what to expect and know that their needs are being met. For our kids, this means having a consistent routine. Knowing they get dropped off with a familiar teacher and that the schedule of the day will follow the same pattern day to day, including meals, naps, potty, and playtime. It means knowing what kids are in their room and what to expect of their behavior. When teachers change, or schedules change, or illnesses and vacations happen, this all throws off a child's sense of safety and the whole cycle has to start over.

Once a child feels safe in their environment, they will start to build relationships and the question "am I loved" can start being fulfilled. This has a lot to do with trust. I trust my teacher will meet my needs, that they will pay attention to me and bond with me. If I cry, my teacher will comfort me. If I am frustrated, my teacher will help me. If I'm lonely, there will be classmates to play with me. It also has a lot to do with noticing. My teacher notices my feelings, my interests, and wants to hear more about them.

It takes a lot of work to accomplish these 2 steps and teachers have to work hard every day to make sure it's happening. How can they make the child feel safe when one of their teachers is gone (illness, vacation, or otherwise)? How can they make the child feel safe when mealtime is running late? How can they make the child feel safe when they are transitioning to another

room? The safety issues can be a lot easier to manage than love. Every child's needs and temperament are different, so what works for one child may not work for another. Every child's home life is different, and we often have no idea what happens outside of our doors, so it takes time, patience, and attention to figure it out.

So how does a teacher earn this trust, respect, and show their students that they are loved? By comforting a child at drop off when they don't want to separate from their parent, even if it takes a long time. By noticing when a child needs help and going to them. By helping them create friendships in the room and mediating when conflict arises. By responding to every cry and scream, even if it's the 10th or 20th time that day. By staying calm when a child is angry and taking the time to listen to their side of the story. By getting down on their level and playing, talking, and engaging with them. By noticing what their interests are and bringing them into the classroom. By being willing to laugh and sing and play and get silly and make messes. And NOW, the learning can begin.
