PARISH NURSE

POLST Forms: What is it, why have one?
POLST or Physician Order Life Sustaining Treatment, is a form that is filled out by your physician based on what your wishes are in regard to withdraw or withhold life saving measures and/or specific treatments. This is a health care directive.

This form should be kept on your refrigerator at home in case an emergency crew is called to your home. They know to look there to see the legal document of your wishes. A copy should also be on file at your doctor's office(the doctor signed it but should have a copy), at the hospital of choice, with your **Power of Attorney for Health Care**, and your wishes should be known to your family. This form is generally bright green.

It is also important to have a **Durable Power of Attorney for Healthcare** in the case where you are unable to make that decision. This is also a legal document to state who you picked to make your medical decisions in the case you are unable to. Some items that may be on the list for preparing for a Health Care Agent are:

1. What matters most to you ?
2. What are some of your beliefs, preferences, practices?
3. I would want the following person (s) to be contacted to support my belief, preferences, and/or practices.
4. CPR: What are my wishes? If I am hospitalized and my heart stops and breathing stop?
5. Life Support: what are my wishes?
6. Artificial nutrition, Dialysis

Additional Directions: If I am dying and my medical care, support system, and resources allow, my preference would be to die: at home, in hospital, etc.

Please talk to your physician to document your wishes per a **POLST form** and to appoint a **Durable Power of Attorney for Health Care Agent**. If you do not have either done, then your spouse will decide or your oldest child in the event of no spouse. I do have the forms for the Durable Power of Health Care.

Remember to update/change if your decisions have also changed.
